

DELEGATE & FACULTY ADVISOR STANDARDS OF CONDUCT UCMUN 2008

UConn Model United Nations (UCMUN) offers students a unique forum in which to explore international relations and foster international awareness in a mature manner. Please carefully review the following documents with all conference participants. The purpose of these documents is to clearly outline conference rules and expectations, in effort to avoid any disagreeable situations developing during the conference. UCMUN seeks to provide an environment where educational, stimulating, and enjoyable discussion can take place.



DELEGATE STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

UCMUN seeks to form an environment where students may explore and understand the value of cooperation, diversity, diplomacy, and compromise through simulating the United Nations. In order to maintain the integrity of the conference, the respect of all conference participants, and to remain both educational and exciting, students attending the conference must adhere to the following code of conduct. UCMUN does not tolerate reckless, irresponsible, rude, or immature behavior. Students, their legal parents or guardians, as well as Faculty Advisors, ought to review the conference rules in the Delegate Standards of Conduct before students arrive at conference facilities.

Rules Concerning Faculty Advisors

- i. All delegations must be accompanied at the conference and at the Nathan Hale Inn by at least one Faculty Advisor.
- ii. Each Faculty Advisor acts in *loco parentis* and will accept full legal and financial responsibility for the conduct of their delegates throughout the conference. This responsibility includes responsibility for damage to hotel or UConn property committed actively or negligently by the delegates. Faculty Advisors will also assume full legal and financial responsibility for the health and safety of their delegates at all times during the conference.

Rules Concerning Conference Badges and Placards

- i. Delegates must wear their official conference badges at all conference events and at all times within their respective hotels.
- ii. Conference badges may not be altered, defaced, decorated, forged or tampered with in any way.
- iii. Trading of badges amongst delegates is strictly prohibited.
- iv. Borrowing and lending badges is strictly prohibited.
- v. Delegates will be charged for replacement of lost or damaged badges.
- vi. Delegates will be charged for replacement of lost placards.

Rules Concerning Alcohol and Illegal Possessions

- i. Delegates are prohibited from consuming alcohol or any illegal substances
- ii. Any delegate found or suspected of being under the influence or in possession of any alcohol or illegal substance at any time during the conference will be immediately expelled from the conference. Responsible faculty advisors will be notified of such behavior immediately, as will the administration of the respective schools of such delegates.
- iii. Violators will also be subject to the full penalties of applicable federal, state, and/or local laws and ordinances.

Rules Concerning Hotels

- i. UConn students who are not affiliated with the UConn Model United Nations or any other guests may not be invited into a delegate's hotel room or to any UCMUN event by a delegate without expressed consent from the Secretary-General of UCMUN and the respective official faculty advisor.
- ii. Delegates are required to be in their assigned hotel rooms by and after all curfews.

- iii. Delegates not staying at the Nathan Hale hotel must have a faculty advisor that assumes full legal responsibility for the conduct of the delegates. These delegates may not enter the hotel without the expressed consent of the Secretary-General and the respective official faculty advisor.

Rules Concerning Photography

- i. Photographs may be taken throughout the conference for use on the UCMUN website or in the newspaper.
- ii. If a student does not wish to be photographed, they may submit a request to the Secretariat at the start of the conference.

Rules Concerning Conference Behavior

- i. Delegates are expected to behave in a civil, quiet, dignified manner at all times during the conference.
- ii. Delegates are expected to attend all conference events, unless they have received excusal from their respective faculty advisor or a member of the UCMUN Secretariat.
- iii. Delegates are required to turn off all cellular telephones, beepers, pager, and all other electronic devices when attending conference events.
- iv. Delegates are expected to respect all UCMUN staff, speakers, and their fellow delegates.

Rules Concerning Appearance and Attire

- i. Delegates are required to wear Western Business Attire to all conference events
- ii. Men should wear a suit or a jacket and dress pants (no jeans), with a dress shirt and tie.
- iii. Women should wear either a dress, suit, dress pants, or skirt with a blouse or sweater (no jeans). Skirts should be of a professional length.
- iv. Hair, makeup, accessories, and footwear must be professional.
- v. All delegates must be dressed in appropriate Western Business Attire in order to participate in conference events. Those dressed inappropriately will be asked by UCMUN staff to change attire or will

The UCMUN staff, at the discretion of the Secretary-General, reserves the right to dismiss any delegate or school from the conference for inappropriate or illegal conduct.
